PRESENTER

Dr. Pankaj Bhatia, MD, FRCPC obtained his Bachelors of Science in Immunology at the University of Toronto, graduating with high distinction in 2001. He then went on to medical school at the University of Western Ontario and obtained his MD in 2005. Dr. Bhatia completed his General Surgery residency at the University of Western Ontario (now Western University), becoming a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Canada in 2010. He spent the following year as the inaugural Endocrine Surgery fellow at Western, completing this in 2011 while also working as a staff traumatologist at London Health Sciences Centre. Dr. Bhatia joined the staff of Health Sciences North in October of 2011 as a General and Endocrine Surgeon and a Trauma Team Leader. He is currently an Assistant Professor with the Division of Clinical Sciences at the Northern Ontario School of Medicine, the current Program Director for NOSM's General Surgery Residency Program, and an accreditor with the Royal College.
