Program Description

This session will highlight the history of the disease prior to vaccination. There will be discussion surrounding the differences between live versus inactivated vaccines. This session will describe the immunogenicity and seroconversion following vaccination, different routes of vaccine administration and the appropriate site of vaccine administration along with the common myths associated with vaccination.

Objectives

By the end of the program, participants will be able to:

1. Identify the effect of vaccine programs on the resurgence of vaccine preventable diseases.
2. Describe T-cell mediated induced immunity by vaccination.
3. Apply clinical immunization knowledge to practice and reduce the burden of vaccine preventable diseases.
