Program Description

NOSM's Health Sciences Library provides access to a number of valuable OVID SP Databases including Medline, PsycInfo, and EBM databases such as DARE and Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews. This one hour session is an introductory lecture, demonstration and hands-on practice with a focus on MEDLINE. Participants will learn how to use OVID SP search interface as well as Medical Subject Headings (MeSH) as developed by the National Library of Medicine (NLM). No prerequisite is required for OVID: the Basics.

- * Learn how to access OVID SP resources through the Health Sciences Library
- * Develop a better understanding of OVID SP
- * Set up a search strategy and select the appropriate database(s)
- * Learn how to conduct a basic keyword search and how to use subject headings
