### Program Description

Thunder Bay Regional Health Sciences Center, in collaboration with the Northern Ontario School of Medicine, provides once monthly "Regional Education Rounds" (RER), based on a variety of parameters and education material, such as case studies, adverse events, patient care needs, new technologies, evidence based medicine and best practice guidelines, and medical literature. Regional Education Rounds are 1 hour long and videoconferenced to NOSM OTN sites, as well as webcasted for asynchronous viewing. All faculty and healthcare professionals in Northern Ontario are invited to attend the RER. The RER are multidisciplinary, and interprofessional, intended to foster effective team care.

This round will focus on identifying and managing the most common ENT emergencies.

### Objectives

**By the end of the program, participants will be able to:**

- 1) Recognize a broad variety of urgent ENT problems
- 2) Apply the most appropriate early management to urgent ENT cases
- 3) Assess which ENT emergencies require immediate referral

### Presenter

Dr. Andrew Turner was born in St. John's Newfoundland. He obtained a nursing degree in 1972 and worked at St. John's General Hospital Intensive Care Unit for a year and then as a Medic/Radio Operator for Sedco/Amoco Oil Companies off-shore drilling rigs in Grand Bank, Nfld.

He obtained a Medical degree in 1981 while in Newfoundland and worked as family physician from 1982 to 1985 in Gambo, Nfld.

He successfully completed the Otolaryngology/Head and Neck Surgery Program from the University of Western Ontario in London and was also Royal College Certified in 1989. Dr. Turner continued to work in Newfoundland until relocating to Thunder Bay in January 1996.

He is currently the Chief of Surgery at the Thunder Bay Regional HSC and has been since 2001. He is the Co-chair of the Surgical Care Team as well as a member of the Medical Planning Committee and was at one time the President of the Thunder Bay Medical Society. He has acted as Chief of Staff on occasion.
