

Strengthening Connections: A Perspective on the H1N1 Experience

Dr. David Butler-Jones



Dr. David Butler-Jones will provide an overview of the H1N1 influenza pandemic, from his unique perspective as Canada's first Chief Public Health Officer. He will provide insight into how Canada's first pandemic in nearly forty years unfolded, how and why the country was able to respond as it did, and how strengthening relationships between every sector of society will ultimately determine how we respond to future outbreaks.

Dr. David Butler-Jones heads the Public Health Agency of Canada which provides leadership on the government's efforts to protect and promote the health and safety of Canadians.

Dr. Butler-Jones has worked in many parts of Canada in both Public Health and Clinical Medicine, and has consulted in a number of other countries. He has taught at both the undergraduate and graduate levels and has been involved as a researcher in a broad range of public health issues. He is a Professor in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Manitoba as well as a Clinical Professor with the Department of Community Health and Epidemiology at the University of Saskatchewan's College of Medicine. From 1995 to 2002, Dr. Butler-Jones was Chief Medical Health Officer and Executive Director of the Population Health and Primary Health Services Branches for the Province of Saskatchewan. Dr. Butler-Jones has served with a number of organizations. In recognition of his service in the field of public health, York University's Faculty of Health bestowed on Dr. Butler-Jones an honorary Doctor of Laws degree.
