The Northern Ontario School of Medicine is a joint initiative between Lakehead and Laurentian Universities. With office, teaching and laboratory facilities on each of the campuses in Thunder Bay and Sudbury, the school also has multiple teaching and research sites distributed across Northern Ontario, in large and small communities. The School contributes to improving the health of people in Northern Ontario.

NOSM is currently inviting applications for a tenure track position at the Assistant or Associate Professor rank depending upon qualifications. Successful candidates will be expected to actively contribute to quality improvement in medical education, teach undergraduate medical students and postgraduate residents in a case-based curriculum, undertake innovative research, and participate in administrative activities. Supervision opportunities are available for NOSM students (undergraduate, postgraduate and in a newly proposed graduate program) and graduate students at Lakehead or Laurentian Universities.

The incumbent will provide leadership in the design, implementation, and continuous improvement of the undergraduate and postgraduate medical education programs. The ideal candidate will have a background in medical or higher education and an understanding not only of educational theory and practice but also evolving trends in science and/or other disciplines involved in medical education (eg., simulation, social accountability, competency based education), health, models of health care delivery (e.g., team-based interprofessional care), and patient experience and expectations. The incumbent will be proficient in at least one of qualitative and quantitative methodologies.

Applicants should have a Ph.D, or MD/Ph.D, an active research program with evidence of research excellence and demonstrated or potential ability to attract external funding and a commitment to mentorship and teaching. Evidence of successful university teaching experience would be an asset.

Appointments begin July 1, 2017 in either Thunder Bay or Sudbury. NOSM faculty may also hold positions with Laurentian University, Lakehead University, or other organizations. Remuneration is competitive and will be based on qualifications and experience. Position is subject to budgetary approval. Review of applications will begin December 15, 2016 and will continue until the position is filled.
