NICHE is a group of inter-institutional leaders, including faculty members, who hold key educational and clinical leadership roles in enhancing and advancing an interprofessional approach to learning, practice, and research in Northern Ontario. The goal of the conference is to strengthen and build NICHE as a pan-Northern academic consortium pursing excellence in IPE and collaborative practice through fostering scholarship in interprofessional education and practice in Northern Ontario.

- Sharing our lived experience the progress in practice.
- Promote and disseminate research in the field.
- Explore innovative educational strategies to prepare a "collaborationready" workforce.

The NICHE community is pleased to have the educational partners of North Bay host the 2017 conference with the theme *Partnering to Advance* Interprofessional Learning: Education and Practice. This innovative development will offer opportunities for health-related research and IPC that includes Indigenous medicine, traditional practises and healing from Western and Eastern medicine.
