The deadline for abstract submission is Friday, May 10, 2019.

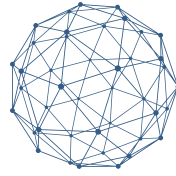

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- Research work submitted should be original and innovative.
- Ethics approval (animal care or REB), if applicable, must be in place.
- The abstract submission form and word template is accessible online at nosm.ca/nhrc.
- Abstracts may not exceed 300 words in length, and must be submitted using the Word template provided. Please use Arial font, 12 pt.
- Presentations will be either in oral or poster format.
- Abstracts accepted for oral presentation will be allotted 10 minutes with an additional 5 minutes for discussion.
- Where necessary, handouts must be provided by, and at the expense of, the author(s).
- Posters must be designed to fit poster boards 3' high by 4' wide.
- Poster presenters are responsible for producing all materials for the poster display, including set-up and take down, and are required to attend their poster during designated periods.
- All presenters must confirm their intent to participate and are required to pay the appropriate registration fees.
- Please do not use Greek symbols or special characters. Please spell out the words.
- **Abstracts will be printed exactly as submitted. Please ensure accuracy.**

Authors of submitted abstracts will be informed of the Scientific Committee's decision during the week of **June 3, 2019**. Acceptance notices will be sent by email. Subsequent communications, including details on the format and timing of oral and poster presentations will be sent to the designated contact person.
