

Resident Guide to Teaching NOSM Phase 3 Students

As residents, you will be exposed to medical students during your training to help develop your teaching skills. In most cases, you will be teaching NOSM Phase 3, Year 4 medical students. For your reference, the following is general breakdown of the NOSM undergraduate information:

- Phase 1 Years 1 and 2 on campus in Sudbury and Thunder Bay
- Phase 2 Year 3, 8 month long Comprehensive Community Clerkship in smaller Northern Ontario communities
- Phase 3 Year 4, six 4-week core rotations and 20 week of electives
 Rotations: Children's Health, Emergency Medicine, Internal Medicine, Mental Health, Surgery and Women's Health

"Top Ten" list of things that you need to know when teaching a Phase 3 medical student:

#10 – Any faculty or resident providing health care to a medical student cannot have any current or future involvement with academic assessment or promotion decisions for those medical students. *12.4*

#9 – Phase 3 medical students may need to be excused from clinical activities or academic sessions to seek out personal health care. *12.5*

#8 – Medical students are required to report situations in which their health poses a risk of harm to patients. 9.10

#7 – Phase 3 medical students are required to have a faculty member or resident observe them doing two, history and physicals on each core rotation using a DOCS form (available on One45 or in paper form, from the student) *9.4*

#6 – Assessment of Phase 3 medical students consists of "Progress Testing" completed quarterly and End of Rotation Assessment completed by preceptors or clinical leads. The End of Rotation Assessment assesses clinical performance (medical expert, communicator, collaborator, leader, heath advocate and scholar) and professional behaviour (honesty, respect, self awareness, responsibility). *7.10*

#5 – The PARO contract does not apply to medical students in Phase 3. Phase 3 medical students can take 2 personal days per year (requires pre-approval).

#4 – Medical students in Phase 3 can work a maximum of 60 hours per week not including call (includes clinical and teaching time). Residents are to respect their schedules set by the Hospital Coordinator.

#3 – The on-call requirement for Phase 3 medical students is up to 1 in 4 averaged out over 4 weeks. Each rotation will determine its own specific call requirements (in-house vs home call).

#2 – Each rotation has a set of objectives, and list of required conditions and procedures (found on <u>MyCurriculum</u>) that medical students must be exposed to during their rotation (students log these using One45). *6.1, 6.2*

#1 – Mistreatment and/or harassment of medical students is not tolerated at NOSM as per the policy available here (<u>Discrimination and Harassment Policy and Procedures</u>).
