Travel options	Kenora Airport is located 5 <u>nautical miles</u> (9.3 km; 5.8 mi) east northeast of the city centre. <u>Highway 17</u> passes through Kenora's urban core, and the <u>Highway 17A</u> Kenora By-Pass goes around the city. Both routes are designated as part of the <u>Trans-Canada Highway</u> . <u>Highway 658</u> extends northerly from Kenora to Redditt. <u>Kenora Transit</u> operates three routes, from Monday to Saturday, 7:00am to 6:30pm. <u>Ontario Northland</u> provides bus service to and from Kenora. Kenora is accessible from <u>Lake of the Woods</u> , the sixth largest freshwater lake that reaches 15 communities in Ontario, 3 communities in Manitoba and 5 communities in Minnesota.

Catchment area and demographics	Kenora, Ontario has an approximate census population of 15,500 with a service area population of approximately 30,000. Approximately 25% of the census population identifies as First Nations, Metis or Inuit.

The Hospital's core programs include emergency and ambulatory care, chronic care, mental health, maternal and child health, and acute care services which include general medicine, intensive care and surgical services. It also manages a broad range of services including dialysis, chemotherapy, diagnostic imaging, mammography, ultrasound, addiction counseling and detoxification, a sexual assault centre, physiotherapy and rehabilitation services, ambulance (land and dedicated air), palliative care and various education programs.
