COMMUNITY DESCRIPTION

POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHICS

The population of Chapleau and surrounding area is just under 2,000, with a labour force of about 1,650 people. Approximately 48% of Chapleau residents are bilingual (English-French). There are three neighbouring First Nation communities: Chapleau Cree First Nation, Chapleau Ojibwe First Nation, and Brunswick House First Nation, with band members living both on and off of the First Nation community. The Chapleau area is also home to a significant Métis population.

Chapleau and surrounding area is deeply rooted in the fur trade, railway, and logging industry. The mining industry has grown significantly in recent years.

AMENITIES

Amenities

Chapleau offers all basic amenities including a grocery store, pharmacy, bank and credit union, insurance broker, churches, gym, library, LCBO, The Beer Store, hardware and furniture store, coffee and pastry shops, restaurants and motels, auto and small engine repair, bargain store, gift shops, full service gas stations, and convenience stores.

Activities

Chapleau is an outdoor enthusiast's paradise. The area is well-known for being the home of the world's largest Crown Game Preserve. Residents and visitors practice a variety of outdoor activities including camping, canoeing, kayaking, hiking, bird watching, biking, swimming, fishing, hunting, and boating. There are several nearby provincial parks and private camps, as well as a community recreation complex which houses the arena, curling rink, and an events space. There is also a ninehole golf course and club house and a downhill ski club.

Schools and Daycare

Chapleau has a French and English daycare, as well as two high schools and three elementary schools under the direction of three school boards: Algoma District School Board, Huron-Superior Catholic District School Board, and Le Conseil scolaire de district catholique du Nouvel-Ontario. Adult learners can access the Chapleau Learning Centre, Formation PLUS, as well as online distance education through Contact North.

There are a number of community organizations and clubs catering to various interest groups including the Francophone community, Métis community, seniors, athletics, and arts and culture.

TRAVEL OPTIONS

Chapleau is linked to Timmins and Sault Ste. Marie, via Highway 101, and to Sudbury via Highways 129 and 17.

Rail

The Budd Car, operated by Via rail, offers train service travelling alternately east to Sudbury or west to White River with weekly stops in Chapleau. Travellers and residents can reach southern Ontario by Via Rail on the Canadian National Railway which stops regularly in Foleyet, one hour east of Chapleau.

Air

International travel can be accommodated at Toronto Pearson International Airport, with connecting regional air service in Timmins, Sault Ste. Marie, and Sudbury. Chapleau operates a municipal airport that is used for emergency services, and is host to the Ministry of Natural Resources base, which is used for fire suppression water bombers.

CLINICAL SERVICES

CATCHMENT AREA AND DEMOGRAPHICS

Chapleau General Hospital serves the communities of Chapleau, Sultan, Chapleau Cree First Nation, Chapleau Ojibwe First Nation, and Brunswick House First Nation, with a combined total population of just under 2,000.

HOSPITAL DESCRIPTION / SERVICES

Chapleau General Hospital has 13 acute care beds and operates a 24-hour emergency department, 24-hour laboratory and diagnostic imaging, and pharmacy services. Patients can access a medical videoconferencing and rehabilitation service facility that links them to specialists across the province.

The hospital also offers a variety of specialty services and clinics including diabetes education, advanced foot care, dietitian counselling, occupational therapy, as well as clinics by the following visiting specialists: paediatrician, physiotherapist, audiologist, chiropractor, and chiropodist.

PRIMARY CARE MODEL / CLINIC SETUP / ALLIED HEALTH SUPPORT

Our primary care model is setup and funded under a Rural and Northern Physician Group Agreement (RNPGA) with the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care. The Chapleau and District Family Health Team is an allied support team of RNs, RPNs, NPs, Pharmacist, Chiropodist, and Social Workers that assist the RNPGA in delivering primary care services to our patients and community alongside the Saari Medical Clinic which is operated by our two physicians.

OTHER CLINICAL VENUES AND SERVICES

The Township of Chapleau offers a Handi Transit bus to citizens within township boundaries, but with limited hours and days of service.

There are a number of car dealerships in the neighbouring community of Wawa, as well as in nearby Timmins, Sudbury, and Sault Ste. Marie.

FOOD OPTIONS

Chapleau Valu-Mart services the community of Chapleau and surrounding area. There is a variety of restaurants including dine-in options offering Canadian, Greek, Indian, and Italian cuisine, as well as two coffee and pastry shops, and several fast food options.
