Resident Loan Interest Relief Program (RLIRP)	on-call services beyond their normal work day. The HOCC program provides funding for hospital on-call coverage to offset coverage expenditures previously borne by hospital operating budgets. Under this program Ontario medical residents are not required to pay principal or interest on government students loans granted from any Canadian jurisdiction during the period of a medical residency. In return, the resident agrees to provide physician services in Ontario for five years following the completion of the medical residency.	There are two requirements for participation in the RLIRP: 1. The participant must enter into a Return of Service (ROS) Agreement with the MOH and; 2. Enter into a Medical Resident Loan (MRL) Agreement with the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU).
