CATCHMENT AREA AND DEMOGRAPHICS

Anson General Hospital is an acute general hospital which provides a wide range of in-patient, chronic care, emergency, out-patient, ambulatory care and long-term care services. Currently, the hospital is designated as having 19 acute, 1 hospice suite, 15 continuing care, and 69 long-term care beds.

A 34-bed hospital situated in the town of Iroquois Falls, Anson General Hospital services surrounding communities with a variety of health care such as physiotherapy, laboratory, diagnostic imaging, electrocardiogram, clinical nutrition, Holter Monitoring, diabetes program and OTN. They maintain a 24-hour a day, 7 days a week emergency department.

Their closest referral hospital is Timmins & District Hospital which is about one hour away.

PRIMARY CARE MODEL / CLINIC SETUP / ALLIED HEALTH SUPPORT

The Iroquois Falls Family Health Team located behind the Anson General Hospital is a medical care team focused on family and community health who coordinate patient care in order to assess and treat injuries or illness. This team includes family physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, a dietitian and a mental health worker.

They offer the following services and programs: Family Medicine Clinic, Diabetes Education Program, Annual flu shot clinic, memory assessment, well-baby/well child including immunization, health links, walk-in clinic, women's wellness clinic and dietitian.

Amalgamated with Anson General Hospital since April 1998, South Centennial Manor is 69-bed home for the aged is located off-site and is termed a charitable home and operates at 100% occupancy. South Centennial Manor prides itself on its cozy, homelike atmosphere and is pleased to offer the following services: nursing and personal care service, daily living assistance, treatment and medication administration, special diets, room and board, laundry services, social and recreational programs, physician services, on-site therapy services, foot care and other optional services.
