#### 1. Concept of Social Accountability

- Social accountability (SA) is understood and applied differently across/within countries
  - Geopolitical contexts
  - Languages
  - ?Links to other concepts such as EDI, community service

#### 1. Concept of Social Accountability

- SA must infuse all activities of medical schools
- SA explicitly expressed in schools' mission statement
  - SA principles are universal; must be recognized and applicable universally
- A practical definition of SA must be agreed upon with defined mechanisms to ensure medical schools apply the definition

## 2. Accreditation process

- Accreditation / QA processes vary between / within countries
- Country owning of accreditation system = easier adaptation of SA standards
- Accreditation is only a tool, often UGME-centric
  - Culture of program evaluation needed
- Political, governmental, institutional, and programmatic leadership can strongly influence education curricula, accreditation, and SA

## 2. Accreditation process

- External (international) parties play an important role; change though must come from national bodies and implemented within institutions, driven by internal and external stakeholders.
- Internationalization of accreditation seems opposite in focus to the SA goal to serve the needs of defined, local populations.

- Accreditation standards: essential for serious consideration of SA
- A SA lens should permeate all standards
- SA (and thus accreditation) reflects evolving needs.
