- 2. Submit only factual information with specific dates.

3. Submit all relevant supporting documentation with your completed form (university accommodations, medical notes, accident reports, etc.).

- 2. Describe your exceptional circumstance (approx. 50 words maximum)
 - Include specific timelines (start and end dates)
 - Clear, factual description of the circumstances
 - Focus on one circumstance only

- **3. Academic Impact** (approx. 50 words maximum)
 - Which academic terms/years were affected or;
 - Which specific courses were most impacted
- Academic Accommodation(s) Received (approx. 100 words maximum)
 NOTE: Documentation is required if you were registered and received accommodation(s).
 - Did you receive formal academic accommodation at any point during your undergraduate studies?
 - When the accommodation(s) began
 - The specific nature of the accommodation(s)

- 5. Adaptation and resilience (approx. 100 words maximum)
 - Strategies you have developed to address this exceptional circumstance
 - How you have grown or developed as a result

- 6. Preparation for Medical School (approx. 100 words maximum)
 - How your experiences during this period have prepared you to undertake the rigorous study required in medical school
 - How you plan to manage if similar circumstances arise during medical school
