



Kenora is on the furthest edge of Ontario and the Northern Region. It is in the traditional territory of the Anishinaabe people of Treaty 3. Kenora is surrounded by 28 First Nations Communities and has a high percentage of Indigenous people (21% in 2016). The Kenora region is supported by the All Nations Health Partners (ANHP) which includes Indigenous, municipal and health care leaders who signed a Resolution in ceremony in 2017, to work towards the development of a seamless, patient-centered health care system. The ANHP aim to provide the right service, at the right time, in the right setting, for everyone in the Kenora region with cultural safety allowing the blending of traditional and mainstream medicines for wholistic healing. In 2019, the ANHP became one of the first Ontario Health Teams, as well as the first from the North, the smallest, and the only team with full Indigenous and community partners.

Through organizational and community collaboration and partnerships and with the support of the ANHP, Physicians provide health care in and with the following First Nation's communities:

COMMUNITY DESCRIPTION

POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHICS

[Grand Council Treaty #3](#) is 55,000sq. miles spanning from west of Thunder Bay to north of Sioux Lookout, along the international border to the province of Manitoba. The [City of Kenora](#) is located within the territory of the Anishinaabe Nation, 208km east of the Manitoba border on the northern shores of Lake of the Woods. The [Kenora District](#) spans 407,269km² and has a population of more than 70,000.

Summer weather is June through September when temps can reach 25-30°C with the hottest month being July. The beaches and lakes are plentiful with amazing swimming and water recreation.

Winter is December to March and the coldest month is usually January when temps can reach -30°C. There is very little humidity in the winter months and the air is dry with clear skies and plenty of sunshine. It is important to dress warmly with proper coat, hat, mitts, and boots.

'Shoulder Seasons' (spring and fall) tend to be cooler but enjoyable! Wearing layers during these months is important for outdoor activities and being prepared for warm-dry to cooler-wet weather with raincoat, rain boots, and bug repellent.

TRAVEL OPTIONS

Kenora is located on the Trans-Canada Highway 17, 210km east of Winnipeg, MB, 488km west of Thunder Bay and is accessible by road, air, and boat!

Bus Service

[Ontario Northland](#) provides bus service to and from Kenora from many communities including Winnipeg and Thunder Bay. If you don't want to drive, an easy way to get here is a flight to Winnipeg and bus to Kenora (drop off is at the hospital, a few steps from the NOSM apartments). Locally, there is [Kenora Transit](#) with a bus stop in front of the hospital.

Air Travel

The [Kenora Airport](#) is 9km from downtown with [North Star Air Ltd. - Passenger Charter Cargo Services](#) flights and [Enterprise rental](#) car available. Local Taxi service will pick up at the airport.

Water Travel

Kenora is accessible from [Lake of the Woods](#), the sixth largest freshwater lake, reaching 15 communities in Ontario, 3 communities in Manitoba and 5 communities in Minnesota. In the summer months, [Green Adventures](#) offers a water-shuttle service to Coney Island, one of the lake's most pristine and eventful beaches!

CLINICAL SERVICES

CATCHMENT AREA AND DEMOGRAPHICS

Catchment area includes the City of Kenora, surrounding First Nation communities, and unorganized territory with a service area population of approximately 30,000 which more than doubles in the summer months. The largest Aboriginal population are that of the First Nations followed by Metis and Inuit.

HOSPITAL DESCRIPTION / SERVICES

Lake of the Woods District Hospital is a 81-bed acute care hospital located in Kenora, Ontario on the shores of beautiful Lake of the Woods. LWDH is staffed by an incredibly dedicated team providing quality patient-centered care to residents of the City of Kenora, surrounding communities and the large seasonal population. LWDH is a fully accredited hospital under the national standards of Accreditation Canada.

The LWDH Emergency Department (ED) provides 24-hour care for persons requiring emergency or urgent care. Since May 2023 LWDH has grown a Nurse Practitioner (NP) Service to address seasonal surges in patient volumes, and decrease ED wait times. Patients attending the ED who are triaged as less acute, with a Canadian Triage and Acuity Scale score of 4 or 5 may be seen by skilled and caring NPs. The ED has, on average, 20,000 visits annually.

The 3-suite OR is staffed with 3 General Surgeons and 4-GP Anaesthetists, plus several other visiting specialists

Outpatient services include rehabilitation, dialysis, chemotherapy, surgical services and a gold standard slate of diagnostic imaging services, including Kenora's first ever MRI Suite which opened in September 2025. LWDH also supports a busy visiting specialist program and full scope of community Mental Health & Addictions programming.

The Laboratory is staffed 24/7 and clinical services include Biochemistry, Hematology, Transfusion Medicine, Microbiology and Surgical Pathology

LWDH has 24-hour air ambulance and medical transport service provided by Ornge. There are helipads on five First Nation communities and five district communities in our district.
